

- 17 Jan Bryan, Texas — Goiania, Brazil (Travel Day's)
SUN Left College Station 9 am; arrived Houston Intercont. Airport 11 am; Left by 1:20 via continental; finding Sasa Mahmood on same plane, going to Goiania also. Arrived Miami 4:30 pm; Tena, Mike & Jimmy there to meet us. Had juice, sandwich, & mikes wants Lepidostrich and Hyalomedusa tissues. Left on VASP for Brazil at 7:30 pm. Arrived Fortaleza Brazil at 2:20 am, 1 hour on ground, then Salvador at 4:30 am, 1½ hrs on ground; and Sao Paulo at 7:30 am (10:30 Brazil time). We stayed in airport until 6 pm; waiting for flight to Goiania, arriving there at 7:30 pm. Nelson & 3 students met us and we drove to Nelsons, 12 Floor Apt., then out to dinner; & finally back to Apt. at midnite.
- 18 Jan. Mon. Goiania, Brazil
TUES up at 6:30 am; ate breakfast in apt.; to office by 8:30, examined several dozens of Liophis poecilogyrus, L. almadensis, L. miliiaris (1); L. reginae; L. oligolepis; L. jaegeri (1), L. meridionalis (stc); L. dilatatus (2); L. paucidens, L. typhlus, L. anomalous (4) (Argentina); Pseudobales agassizii (3) + and I.D. many other sp.s. Ate lunch about 1 pm; & finished lab work at 5:30 pm. Lost my voice today! knew it was going to happen!! We left university at 6:00 pm; then to Nelson's Apt., 2 hour nap; then we are going to eat about 10 pm.
- 20 Jan wed Goiania, Brazil
up at 7:00 am; breakfast of bread & cheese, then to office. Looked at Typhlops & Leptotyphlops most of day, plus counted teeth on 27 Liophis paucidens

20 Jan (cont.) Ate lunch at Nelson's house; food prepared by his mom. Very good rice, chicken, & other vegetables. Common to eat Palm heart, Yucca, Manioc, for meal. Back to office at 3:pm, looked at odds & ends of collection. Finished at 5:30pm, back to apt., quick nap until 8pm, then to Evan's girl friend's house party. Here we were treated to Brazilian music by band, Brazilian geologist cooked "Barbecue"; plus we had lots of beer, wine, rum, & soft drinks. Saw first wild lizard on wall, (Hemidactylus mabouya). Finally left party (via Marcio) for Apt. at 1:15am, in sack by 1:30am.

21 Jan. Goiânia, Brazil

Thurs. Up at 7am; cheese-bread breakfast; to office by 9:15am; worked on Apostolepis sp. until noon; at which time 8 of us went to fish place & had 4.5k of Peacock Bass, & soft drinks & salad. Back at office at 2pm; Sandra took Mary & I to buy cards & stamps. Worked again on Apostolepis in PM until 5:30. Back at Apt. by 6pm. Nelson went to local shop & bought ham, cheese, & bread. Mary & I decided to stay in this pm; so we made sandwiches, & watched CNN, while Nelson & Sasa left for dinner. In sack by 11pm.

22 Jan. Goiânia, Brazil

Fri Up at 6:30; cheese/bread breakfast, Nelson left early because of meeting, Marcio was to pick us up at 8:30; instead Evan got us at 9:30; immediately worked on Lepisiotis & Apostolepis, lunch at 12:30 (Italian) and back to Lab for Apostolepis work until 3:30pm. My throat is getting better, with antibiotics

(22 Jan (Cont.) Nelson said we would meet Fish + Wildlife folks at 5pm; + go to site on Rio Araguaia, the border between Mato Grosso and Goias. The site is 75 km w (dirt road) o/f São Miguel do Araguaia (^{47 mi} 455 km by road) from Goiania in the very NW corner of the state. The site is near the village of Chapeu de Palha at $13^{\circ}S$; $+60^{\circ}30'W$. We managed to visit Fish + Wildlife at 5pm + stayed until 6:15 pm. Visited the head of CENAGUA, Vitor Hugo Contarotti, Jefe o/f "Centro Nacional doa Quelônios da Amazonia. Back to Lcl at 6:30pm. Waited for Nelson to finish business; caught a Hemidactylus mabouya on wall. Mary photographed it, + I put it back. Also saw a large Tropidurus _____ on wall. By 8:30, all ready to go eat. Went to Barbago Restaurant, Famous Brazilian chain - F restaurants - Drank + Talked until midnite, then ordered Food. Back at apt by 1:30am. You don't get much sleep here!

23 Jan.
Goiania, Brazil

SAT. Up at 7:10 am., Mary + I stayed in until 9:30, then walked to Flamboyant Mall ± 1 mi, + bought footbats 68 + 48 $\frac{1}{2}$, for trip to interior. Waited until 1pm; + Ivan drove us to lunch near mall. Whole crowd there again!! Nelson must be broke by now feeding all those kids! Back to Apt, shower, rest, + back to Nelson's Mom's Apt by 6pm. She fed us very good meal!! Nelson then took Mom, us, Sasa, Juliana, Sandra, + Maria to club. - Stayed one hour, met Ivan there, then Marcos. We took off at 10pm to get early sleep because we leave at 6:30am tomorrow. I need to get Regalos!!

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

SUN

Goraria a Base 1, on Rio Crixás-ago 133908S -
Left Goraria at 6:30am, Nelson coming on Tuesday,
drove all morning N thru various towns, got Mainly
Gogis, Nuevo Crixas; to Base 1, some 10km E of
hwy & on Rio Crixás-Ago. This is the station where
they hatch the eggs of P. expansa & release them
back into the Rio Araguaia. We arrived 1:30pm; after
lunch in Nueva Crixas, & will spend night here. I made
photos of group eating in restaurant in Nueva Crixas,
of jeep & car; & then of station (base 1) & of Rio
Crixás-ago below station, & one of mary holding a
Podocnemis skull. Building consists of Office/Radio Room, + P¹⁰

& antenna 30m high



We will leave tomorrow after
Radio tower/equipment is
installed. I plan to take
pictures of turtle shells
Later today. Took 2 dorsal,

Rio
One ventral + one of turtle pen. It is amazing to me
that on the ride here (280mi) Thru what once was Cerrado,
is that there is no Cerrado Left! It is all in cattle
ranches, corn, rice, & other crops. No wonder Nelson
wants to save a piece of it!!


Students having hard time trying to install antenna for base
station to the base on the Rio Araguaia. This is some
100km & is needed to supply information during the
wet season when you cannot drive to the river. Hope
to look around tonight, but have found no ponds to search;
& I have no Flashlight! Maybe I can borrow one from
one of the students.

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24 Jan (cont.) Evan + Sasa, Mary & I caught 8 Bufo paracnemis JV around storehouse, also 1 Ameiva ameiva and 1 Tropidurus orcadicus. We took pictures of toads (2 held by mary) and 3 shots of Ameiva, and 1 of the Tropidurus. Ran out of film & while fishing in my briefcase, I found my razor, which promptly cut the --- of my left thumb!! Now I will be limited to what I can do in 5 days, because we leave on Friday to return to Goraná. Photo of Phrynohyas venulosus JV on building. After supper, with half moon, Sasa, Ivan & I walked to what little seeps of water there were, and found 2 Lepidodactylus fuscus, I heard at least 2 Nyla minuta, and found 2 Scinax fuscovaria on buildings. We also found a very fresh Tropidurus orcadicus ♀ recently ran-over in drive, that had 5 eggs. In sack by 10:30pm.

25 Jan. Slept Rio Crixás-Açu Base 13°39'08"S - 151°14'50"W, 210m Mon. Slept poorly, woke 3:45 with stopped-up nose, followed by coughing. Finally got up 6:30 am. Crew left to go to other base camp, leaving us here to wait on Nelson. We made boat/hr walking trip to inland natural lake on East side of Rio Crixás-Açu. We collected several black-4-limbed tadpoles in small pool adjacent to lake. We also saw several T. orcadicus on way & found 1 Mabuya bistrigata on tree. Dropped lens cap on way in & found it on way out. We were gone about 3½ hrs; returning at 1:30PM. Lake's name Lago do Curumás? (Tremedade). Quick lunch, & rested until 4pm; very warm in building, chased Ameiva & Tropidurus around yard until 6pm. Sasa, Ivan, & Claudião left for skin run to hunt snakes.

25 Jan (cont.) Below is outline of river, base camp, + nearby Lagoons.



The guys came back from snake hunting, but found only Tropidurus oreadicus. They took off 35 min later to fish for freshwater sting rays. The lake in Goliania also exams the venom of those critters. We have a large duo here, but tissues cannot be brought back to USA. I could get alcohol prep? Now 7:45pm, & sun is just setting. Without a light I will not be able to look for frogs this pm. Subboss back from town, brought Mary. I towels! these people really take care of you. I practiced by gator call at the Lagoon, & was able to call up a few juvenile C. jacare. Guys returned from fishing, & brought in one P. manoto (stingray). I took 2 flesh CO at 22 + 95% alcohol muscle tissue. In sack by 10:30pm. High temp 37 - Low 25C.

26 Jan. Rio Crixás-Açu Base Camp.

TUES During night huge thunderstorm rolled in (2am), but didn't last long. The major problem with this site is that it has been converted to cattle ranching, & range forage. The only forest left is along the river & in some places is less than 1m thick. The east side contains more forest, is more swampy & less desirable as pasture. I looked under a pile of lumber toward office & found an Attaetus sp. Took several photos; also found a Mabuya frenata in storage shed, & made photos. Also took 3 shots of Podoecetes expansa hatchling from Rio Moritz (death) of Mato Grosso.

26 Jan (cont.) Claudio, Mary, I looked around fence post pile & found nothing. Electricity has been off since lighting storm last night, but just came back on, found out that Nelson is not arriving until tomorrow about noon. Doesn't give me much time to search the other station in Vareza Forest. The only snake species seen so far at this station are:

Lycophis poecilogyrus, Lycodryas annulata, Oxyrhopus trideminus, Atretus sp., Lizards: Mabuya frenata, Mabuya bistrigata, Tropidurus oreadicus, T. torquatus?

Ameiva ameiva; Caught a juv. T. oreadicus at 3:00 pm.

A description of the Atretus: head black; obscure reddish collar follows black head cap; 3-4 SR long; body reddish brown with single scale black chevrons (49) from collar onto tail, the chevrons may or may not be united & form series of spots in chevron pattern; 3rd-4th SR almost forming obscure ochreous stripe the length of body, 5-6 supral. yellowish, 7th yellowish with black spot in middle, infral. + chin pale yellow, pale yellowish tan; uniform; 6k marks on side of nape not forming chevrons; body pattern at times resembles reticulations; 112 SR without 6k marks, almost uniform orange; elongate preoc., Postoc. 2, supra/infral 2/7; SR 17-17-17; vent. 168, sc 27;

Freshwater stingray is Potamotrygon motoro.

Went out at 4pm, with 7 person crew, we turned fence posts for 2 hrs; found several ♂♀ Tarantulas; 2 L. Fuscus, 1 Physalaemus cuvieri, + 1 M. frenata. Ranch hands brought in Crotalus durissus. Found, at none of the pictures I made today rolled thru the camera. I will start again tomorrow.

Collected frogs near seep by river, Hyla minuta, Hyla punctata, Phrynobatrachus venulosa, Physalaemus pustulosus, Leptodactylus fuscus, Leptodactylus chacuensis? Adenomeria?

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27 Jan.

WED

Rio Crisás - Aco Base Camp - São Miguel - Rio Araguaia
Up at 7 am; wish I had a tape recorder, P. petensi has a distinctive call! Made 3 shots P. expansa hatching, (MT loc.) Photo Atractus, H. minuta, L. fuscus, Tarantula ♀ + egg case, Leptodeirulus sp. 80mm; P. petensi; Hyla sp.; M. frenata; Freshwater sting-ray, (3); now, 10 am, + probably made pictures too early! Made 2 more pictures of Ameiva ameiva ♀ + turned it loose. Tissue of Atractus taken; a Sasa has taken tissues from all of the amphibians. Very warm morning + humid." Nelson is due in today, but I don't know the time. We are supposed to spend nite at Rio Araguaia Base Camp, but so far we haven't gotten there! Nelson showed up at 12:30 with 3 girls, 1 guy. We left station at 2:30 pm; arrived São Miguel at 3:30; bought groceries + battery for Mary; 8° R; had coke, + finally on way to Base Camp of Rio Araguaia. Arrived + Boat ramp at 6pm. 10min ride down river to camp. Very warm here. Saw many familiar birds on way down (70km dirt road); Maguire, wood stork, Ani, Lapwing, herons, limpkin, etc. Mary + I placed in one room with two single beds. Going frog hunting after supper. Mosquitos bad; waded in water croch deep to catch Hyla raniceps, Leptodeirulus occellatus; Hyla minuta, small Leptodeirulus sp.; Caiman jacare ♀ + bat - Molossus sp. Back by 10pm; shower, notes, + bed!

28 Jan. Rio Araguaia Base Camp $12^{\circ}54'59.3''S$ - $50^{\circ}30'44.0''W$

Thurs. Up at 7am; on boat by 8:15pm; up stream for 25 min to trail to Lake on MT side; 2 mi walk - too flooded to proceed; back to boat by 10:30, no boat! 11:45 boat returns; meantime, I collect tad + hatching, + 1 Adult L. mystacinus. Back to camp for lunch, ± 2pm, photograph H. raniceps, L. occellatus? Helicops


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28 Jan (cont.) *Hypolepis* (dorsal + ventral view). Nelson + crew return at 2:30pm from Club! Now setting up weather station for 120 days. The *H. hypolepis* SR = 23; ♂, SC = 88. Black ventral with small scattered white spots, Dorsum Light Brown, with obscure mid-dorsal + two distinct lateral rows of black spots. The ventrolateral black spots are 2 to 3 SR long. The lateral black spots smaller than mid-dorsal ones, the lat. blk spots are not intercalary spots but opposite the mid-dorsal spots. The ventrolateral black marks largest, sep. from each other by 1-1/2 SR of dorsal color; the greatest length of one of these is 3 1/2 blks; white (cream) chin band lab to lab; another wider one at end of mouth line, passing onto last supral. Tan (cream) belly spots on outer ends of ventrals (not in middle), ~ 4 on R. side, spots continuous onto sc, but not as uniform or distinct. There is a bluish streak from pectoral notch posteriorly for about 13 SR.

We are flooded at station, + we are living on a piece of ground ~ 100' wide + 75' long; very little collecting can be done. I found a juv. Ameruva amarina half in + out of water between ceiling brick tiles. After support made a quick tour, 1. leptodactylus ocellatus? Juv.; + heard nothing, moon almost full, + no rain.


29 Jan Rio Araguia Base Camp 7am = 26.° C
Fri 7am; dogs chewed up my socks! Guys (WL officials) Left during night, confiscated 60kg of commercial fish. Didn't return until 9am. The Molossid bat I caught by hand is Nyctinomops Laticaudatus. Nelson + some students went down river for 2 hrs to try to get stingrays. We will go at ~ 2pm for forest on Goia's side of river. Some of the fish arrived for the troops to eat this evening.



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(29 Jan (Cont.) I rowed across to other house south of station, owner's only there in dry season: Found nothing! Nelson + crew back by 11 am; motor prop on shaft became loose + had to return. We all may go to forest this pm. We will have fish for supper. As usual, things were not well planned - I, Mary, Sergio, Nelson, + new student went to trail into forest 25 min up river. Rather than look for traps, I helped them set out 125 traps, 1 medium tomahawk, 1 small tomahawk + 1 Sherman set per station, partially in a +; 10 sets per line, 3 traps each; started at 3:00 pm, & back by 5:45 pm. Rest of crew not here, so we don't know where they went. Now 6:20 with winds 6 km from NW.



Bait principally papaya, manioc, squash, + banana in Sherman traps. 8:30 pm, still no crew (Nelson, Julie, Marile, Nelson, Sergio, Igor, "cloudia," Kennedy, 8:40 most show up, Kennedy + Igor looking for stingrays. I photographed different genus + species today, but no tissue taken, it was injected with formal! = Dasyatis? Good boiled fish supper prepared by Vanderley - his speciality. Nelson wants to get early start in morning, ± 6 am for trapline. Tomorrow is our last day in the field, we return to Goiania on Sunday. Now 11pm.

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30 Jan Rio Araguaia Base Camp

sat.

Up at 6am; on river by 8am; checked trapline baited with non-sweet squash, manioc, etc.; caught nothing in 125 traps. Came back by Fish Club & picked up Igor who had speared 3 stingrays for venom. We are to have the family Ctenidae (Semaphrochilodus cf. bromae but no tail stripes (6k). I took photo of piranha (Serrasalmus nattereri) caught yesterday. Igor just brought in Lophius nigricans from next building yr river. I will photo it later. ♀ 17-17-15, 80+sc; very black venter with few yellowish orange spots on posterior 2/3 of body. Throat pale pink; (Flesh) 6k face stripe; a black mark on every ventral from 5-6 ventral to last ventral, progressively larger & wider posteriorly until entire ventral is black; 6k stripe on 3rd SR posteriorly & onto tail; sc 1-15+ with 6k marks on yellowish orange ground color; remainder of tail uniform except a few greyish marks on lateral edges. sides of body pale brown; above & below 6k line of SR 3; dark brown (bluish brown) mid-dorsal stripe on 6-10 SR; stem between scales on anterior 1/3 of body yellow; giving speckled appearance when handled. Half of iris cafe color, (up) Lower blk; Ant. 1/4 of body greenish brown dor, & more green laterally, Infraol. Flesh; 6k stripe on snout. From nostril to 3-4 scales beyond last supral.; 6k Lat. stripe on 4th scale now where 17SR; 3-d on remainder where 15SR; ± 150V Made ± 5 photos. Ate baked fish for lunch, including standard rice & beans; had spaghetti also. Packed up suitcase for trip to Goiania tomorrow. ± 570km. IBAMA vehicle will be at Rio Crisas-Agu station to take us on in to Goiania. Sasa Mahmood is staying a couple of more days to talk about job possibilities in Brazil (Genetics).

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(30 Jan (Cont.) At 1:55 Nelson, Juliana, Mary, Vanderley & I made a trip into Sat. Mato Grosso by canoe, about 1:20 min into Large Lake (old part of river) via flooded pasture + fence rows. Once there, we saw 2 troops of howlers, 1 Capuchin, and many birds, including hoatzins, herons, Anhingas, Ani; terns, kingfishers, thornbirds, rails, jacanas, etc. Also found ± 11 canoes with probably 14 legal fishing gear. The guys (Weber, Samuel, + Vanderley) will check them out tonight. we plan to leave around 6am tomorrow for Goiania. Lagoão is the name of the big lake in the middle of the preserve; 30m deep. Change in plans, Mary, Claudiano, Ivan, + I leave at 8pm ± for other station on Rio Crixás-Açu, then in morning leave there for Goiania. Boy, this has been "musical chairs" since we have been here! Said goodbyes to students after supper + underway by 8:30. arrived São Miguel 10:00; + Base by 11:00; + showered + in sack by 11:30. Mary gave everyone their drawings.

31 Jan.
Rio Crixás-Açu Base - Goiania
sun Up at 6am; told everyone goodby + off to Goiania by 8:30am, arriving at 2pm. Had pitstop + quick bread lunch in Goianápolis; - they dropped us off at Nelson's apt. (Kenedy + Luciano = ITAMA); Nelson already here. Took nap from 2:30-4pm; then watched CNN until 6pm; then to Italian restaurant where we waited for Juliana, her mom, + Maria. They arrived 8:30pm, we ate, talked, + Mary + I walked back to Apt., arriving at 11pm. In sack quickly!

1 Feb
Goiania ~ São Paulo
mon Up at 6am; cheese/bread break; off to Nelson's office by 9:30, after packing clothes, + getting car

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1 Feb (cont.) From dealership. Finally at office by 10am; I counted scales on Lophis oligolepis from Rioama (16) & measured all of them. It apparently is a valid species but may well hybridize with reginae in the vicinity of Iquitos. Ate lunch at "eat all you can place" & then back to Nelson's apt. Nelson gave me \$400 American to send Jack to buy books, & a disk to send also with MS on it. 6 Brazilian students coming, none are members of SSAR, HL, or NSCH. Can they get student break? Brazilian dollar dropped too much to compensate for them coming! Nelson needs me to call local committee to establish this is ok. Went to Mall at 4pm; & purchased gifts for Maya, Tana, Dawn, Lanore, & Linda. I also bought highest quality gifts for Drs. Cole & Wiley. Roughly spent 578 Am. dollars. Back to Nelson's Apt. Quick shower, & on way to Airport by 5:50pm. Arrived 6:05; checked in, 7:05 said goodby to Nelson & Juliana, & on board to Sao Paulo by 7:30pm. Arr. Sao Paulo 9:00am; messaged around buying water & Candy, & settled in for 2 hr wait until boarding 12:10am.

2 Feb -

Sao Paulo Brazil - Miami - Houston - Bryan

Straight flight to Miami, arriving 6:25am; no problem in customs; straight to American Airlines, found early flight home on standby; left 9:45am; arrived Houston 10:50am; (hnd. f.) home by 1pm., paid 64^{c} for parking. Made it to Bryan with no difficulty, but was TIRED!!!

Left C.S. via continental Airlines 8am; arr. Houston 8:30am, to Continental Airline C terminal + left 9:55am for San Jose; arriving 11:55 San Jose time (12:55 TX time); and John Malone, David Laurencio, + Thad met us, but were 10-15 min late because of fire trouble last night. Drove directly from Airport to David's house, (in San Pedro suburb) + met his mom (Dalia) who has MS from Buffalo, NY, + Ph.D from Univ. Houston; talked about her family for several hours; Enjoyed talking about her experiences. John, David + Thad drove to Zoo about 4:30 to see about material collected last night and to bring it back to house for some preservation? now 8pm TX time (7:00 CR time) + they haven't returned.
